

I volunteer with a program called Circles of Concern that originally was affiliated with the Julian Center but is now operating under the umbrella of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church. Circles acts as a bridge between a protected environment and living as an independent person. My friend was looking for something in an upright freezer case so I had positioned myself near her cart with her unprotected open handbag.

As I stood there another young woman nearby was looking at the avocados in a produce rack. She had her year old daughter on her hip and was hold-

ing two potted plants. With her free hand she was trying to open one of those clingy produce bags and pick up some avocados and put them in the bag. I've observed that it is a requirement of motherhood to constantly expand the number of things that can be done at one time and this woman was stretching the limit. She had apparently just popped in for a few items as she did not have a cart. Since her right arm encircled her daughter and one potted plant and her right hand held the second plant I reached out and took a hold of the second plant, the one in her hand. She was momentarily confused but looked into my face and realized I intended to help her and she let go of the plant. She then stooped slightly and put the fruit in the bag. Once she had secured the top of the bag she took the plant from me and said softly, thank you.

My companion returned from the freezer case with her item. She commented, Well I practically had to reorganize their freezer but I finally found what I was looking for. What have you been doing? I responded, Oh, I just have been watching your handbag. Oh, I kinda left that out there didn't I? Thanks for that. — JB
